

Introducing a Pilot Program for Companies That Want to Connect with Veterans Interested in Energy Careers

Due to strong interest, the Center for Energy Workforce Development, in collaboration with Veterans in Energy, is expanding access for companies interested in its Troops to Energy Jobs (TEJ) Program – specifically connections to the veterans' database and Get Into Energy Job Board – through a pilot program that will run through 2025. This program is for energy companies that are not members of CEWD as CEWD members already have access to all resources.

An Overview of the Troops to Energy Jobs Program

The TEJ program has more than a decade of experience in connecting those with military service, and military spouses, to careers in energy; in fact, over this time, we have assisted more than 10,000 veterans with resources to guide career connections. In addition to direct service, TEJ has a strong industry presence with national veterans' organizations, connecting veterans across the globe with information on their professional what's next. For instance, we serve as an Employer Navigator Partner for the Energy Industry with DOL Veteran and Employment Services and offering the Energy Industry Fundamental Credential through a Skillbridge Program through Onward 2 Opportunity at military installations.

BENEFITS OF BECOMING A TEJ SUPPORTER

Troops to Energy Jobs Supporters will have their jobs posted on the Troops to Energy Jobs/Get into Energy Job Board. Jobs will be scraped every night from the company's applicant tracking system. Veterans/service members will be able to search the TEJ job board and find job matches using their Military Occupational Specialty, city and state and/or key skill/knowledge.

TEJ Supporters will be listed on the Troops Energy Jobs Map by state with a link to their career page,
providing veterans/service members with the
opportunity to easily find energy employers in their
desired geographic region. TEJ Supporter Companies will
be listed as a TEJ Employer with the logo listed next to
their company name.

TEJ Supporters will also have access to the Veterans' Database where they can access information on veterans and service members looking for jobs in the industry. The database registers between 80 and 100 veterans/service members each month. Companies will be able to search the database by MOS, skill/experience, state, and other criteria. The database can also be used to track connections with veterans at career fairs/military installation events.

Who should participate?

Energy companies that are not current members of CEWD who are seeking to employ military veterans are prime candidates to be TEJ Supporters. Specifically, the program is open to:

Energy Companies - U.S.-based entities and internationally-based entities with significant business operations in the U.S. that generate, transmit, supply, store, or otherwise provide energy.

Contractors – Who provide important services in the energy workforce ecosystem including 1) in field related to industrial engineering, development, construction, installation, maintenance, storage, safety, or service for renewable energy; 2) on site at a utility or other energy service provider or directly on a utility transmission and distribution system such as system engineering, construction, operation and maintenance, equipment testing, refurbishment and repair, and customer service; 3) off site for a utility or other energy service provider such as engineering modifications, component fabrication, equipment refurbishment, equipment manufacturing, and equipment testing; or 4) providing services to support energy efficiency.

What is the cost to be a TEJ Supporter?

The cost is \$750 for the pilot year for 2025.
